He earned Ph.D. degree from Seoul National University (1998) in Developmental Biology with the topic of “Molecular Studies on Xhoxc8 and Xap2.” He then took 4 years of postdoctoral training in the field of reproductive endocrinology before taking a faculty position at the University of Kentucky in 2002. In 2011, he moved to his current position in the Department of Comparative Biosciences at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, where he serves as the director of graduate program, teaches veterinary students and leads an active laboratory. His laboratory (<http://vetmed.illinois.edu/kolaboratory>) researches on steroid hormone action in regulating gonadal function and the mechanism that endocrine disruptors interfere with gonadal function. His laboratory is funded by NIH, USDA, AHA and some private funding agencies.
